**Bishop of London Launches  
'Training God's People' Appeal**

The Bishop of London, Dr Richard Chartres, launched the Diocese of London's 2011 Lent Appeal here at St Mary with St Alban on March 12th. This year's appeal seeks to raise £64,000 for training priests in Angola and Mozambique.

The money raised will support organisations like St Christopher's Seminary in Maputo, Mozambique where 10 people are currently training for the Priesthood. In Maputo the money will go towards their training in theological, health and community development.

Meanwhile, the Diocese of Niassa in Northern Mozambique, where the number of priests has more than doubled in the past 5 years, already has an idea of how it hopes to spend the donations. The Diocese plans to provide a bike, a Bible and a Prayer Book to each of the priests in training.

The appeal was launched during the highly successful Thomas Traherne Conference.

During the event, entitled *Thomas Traherne: A Spirituality for our Times* the Bishop of London gave the keynote address and was followed by Dr Denise Inge, who has published a number of books on the theology of Traherne.

A poet and spiritual writer, Traherne is buried in the vaults of St Mary's. The event saw readings from his work and a special concert

featuring Gerald Finzi's *Dies Natalis*, a masterful setting of Traherne's most evocative verses for solo tenor and string orchestra.

*The Bishop of London, Dr Richard Chartres said:*

"Our partner churches in Angola, Lebombo and Niassa (in Mozambique) are experiencing remarkable organic growth. In 2010, the first 3 Angolan women were ordained and a further 15 students graduated from the Mission and Ministry Programmes. Niassa too has seen considerable growth over the last 5 years with the number of priests up to 45 from 18."

"As we carry out our own training and education in London, like today's fascinating conference on the work of Thomas Traherne, we should take the opportunity to support the education and training of our partners in Angola and Mozambique through the donations of our Lenten sacrifices and gifts."

*The Revd Joe Moffatt, Vicar of Teddington, said:*

"Traherne is coming into his own as a great classic of Christian thought and imagination. So we're thrilled to be associated with him and to be hosting this high-profile conference which has attracted over 150 participants from both the local area and from as far afield as Germany. This event is a wonderful example of regular churchgoers learning alongside very experienced theologians. As such it is very fitting that we're also hosting the launch of the Diocesan Lent Appeal for *Training God's People* in Angola and Mozambique. As a parish we're committed to supporting this appeal and we hope that it will enable others to participate in the kind of learning we've been doing today."

**Lenten Quiet Day**

As last year, the penultimate session of the Wednesday Lent course will take place during a Quiet Day at St Michael's Retreat House on Ham Common – **Wednesday April 6<sup>th</sup> from 10am-4pm**. The day will include time for prayer and silent meditation, time for learning, time for listening and time for just enjoying the peace and beauty of God's creation in the Convent's beautiful garden. Joe will lead a session on one of Jesus' parables and there will be a short service to conclude the day. This day is open to everyone. Several people who attended last year, with some trepidation, were agreeably surprised at how rewarding a day of near silence in the company of others can be. ## Thomas Traherne Conference

### ◆ 17<sup>th</sup> Century Mystic:

Vicar of Credenhill, Hertfordshire he wrote a huge quantity of brilliant spiritual guidance and beautiful poetry. Briefly in Teddington as Chaplain to Sir Orlando Bridgeman he died aged 38 and is buried under St Mary's church.

### ◆ Hidden Centuries:

Over 200 years he was forgotten and his manuscripts lost.

### ◆ 20<sup>th</sup> Century Resurrection:

Beginning with a find on a bookstall, a huge collection of writing have been recovered, edited and published, creating wide interest.

The Speakers at the Traherne Conference

On 12<sup>th</sup> March a Conference was held to extend the interest in Traherne – all the events had large and enthusiastic attendances.

The Bishop of London opened in St Mary's church and with lucid style and gentle wit gave a brilliant summary of Traherne's work and its remarkable relevance to today's overcrowded world facing climate change and environmental dangers.

After a fine lunch in the hall prepared by the great cook June Demont and a band of helpers, the Conference continued at the University College at Strawberry Hill.

Dr Denise Inge, a leading authority on Traherne, gave a fine scholarly exploration of

a selection of his writings with an emphasis on the quest for happiness (Traherne had a great fondness for the word *felicity*) – not selfishly for oneself but for all people.

The talk was followed by two seminars to discuss the mysticism and the poetry.

The day ended with a splendid concert in St Mary's church by a string ensemble formed by Janet Smith, led by Alexandra Reid and conducted by Mark Austin. After well-known works by Holst and Elgar, the climax came with *Dies Natalis*, a setting by Gerald Finzi of words by Traherne, most movingly sung by Andrew Dickinson, tenor.

A marvellous end to a great day organised by Rev Joe Moffatt and a hard-working host of helpers. *Well done.*

Tools with a Mission enables people to earn a living and to support themselves. TWAM started 25 years ago. It collects and refurbishes tools and equipment no longer required in the UK and sends them overseas. Have you any unloved items you could donate?

For example, and this list is by no means exhaustive, bicycles; garden tools; typewriters; wheelchairs; school books; knitting wool and knitting needles; hand tools for DIY (carpentry, electrical, plumbing); sewing machines (last year 62 were sent from this area), fabric, haberdashery of all kinds including lace,

ribbon, buttons and zips). Tools such as these can give men and women life-changing earning capacity, children a future, and communities hope. Computers and lawn mowers seem to be the only items TWAM are unable to accept.
