It's not intended that the plot should be improved by any planting or placing of other memorials or plaques, simply a way of helping maintain the churchyard.

Church Mice

In about 1980, and in response to some requests from parents of young children, the then Vicar, Raymond Carter, sent a personal letter to all families on the parish roll, inviting them to attend a monthly mid-week communion service (Pram Eucharist) in church on the 2nd Wednesday of every month at 2.30pm. He gently explained it would be "a simple straightforward communion service lasting 25/30 minutes", he wouldn't be perturbed by "the odd scream or screech" and those adults who "had not been confirmed or who did not know or had forgotten what it is all about were as welcome as the rest".

The services proved very popular – albeit noisy – and within a few months it was decided to meet up on the other three Wednesday afternoons for a cup of tea together. The Hall was booked, a committee was set up and the name Church Mice was chosen. My earliest dated copy of committee minutes are for 1982, so we can safely say that discussions on who should make the tea/setup/put away/be keyholder etc are at least thirty years old.

The Church Mice weekly playgroup and the monthly Pram Eucharist continued for some years and provided a wonderful way of making friends and feeling part of the worshipping community in this parish during what can sometimes be a rather isolated, pre-school, period of family life.

Since its incarnation some thirty years ago it still continues and this month sees the renamed St Mary's Church Mice Sing & Storytime open its doors weekly on a Thursday at 9.45am in the Mina Hogan Room at the Parish Hall. If you are looking for something fun to do with your pre-schoolers, please do join them.

Vicar's Viewpoint

In a time when statistics are generally being used to report yet more gloomy news of the economy, it's good to be able to give you some upbeat figures on church attendance in 2011. (I won't speculate on whether the two are related!)

On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day over 1400 people came to one of our services

Our average Sunday School attendance grew from 40 to 50 per week, with over 160 children on the register

We conducted 64 baptisms and 16 weddings

This is all very encouraging. But numbers aren't everything. Helping people to deepen their faith is just as important. That's why we're keen to invite people back, and it's why this month we have a couple of reunion events.

On **February 11th** we're inviting the families of those who've been baptised in 2011 to come to a 'Young Children's Guide to the Church' at 2pm, followed by tea and playtime in the parish hall. Members of the Parish Visiting Team, who visit every baptism family before each service, will be joining the clergy and mini-Sunday School team in hosting this event.

On **February 12th** we're inviting wedding couples from the previous two years to join us for a special service of Choral Evensong, for the Feast of St Valentine, at 6.30pm. This will be a regular Book of Common Prayer Evensong, but with hymns and anthems that are popular at weddings as well as thanksgiving prayers for marriage. The guest

preacher will be the Rector of Chelsea, the Reverend Prebendary Brian Leathard. All are welcome to join us, and to stay for a glass of fizz after the service.

After these two celebrations we'll be inviting people to deepen their faith as they enter into the holy season of Lent.

Firstly, on **Shrove Tuesday, February 21st**, we're having a **Pancake Day Supper Talk at 7.30pm**. The speaker will be Canon Julian Reindorp and his theme is 'The Prophet Amos and the need for social action'. Julian is always erudite, entertaining and provocative, not unlike the prophet himself. So don't miss this stimulating event. Book places via the parish office.

Then on **Ash Wednesday, February 22nd**, we'll have services at both 9.30am and 7.30pm that will include the imposition of ashes as well as holy communion. The evening service will be a sung service with choir anthem and sermon.

I hope that over the month there's something for everyone and that we continue to be a beacon of good news in these difficult times.
